RE: Employment of CRT Clients: Q4 of FY2010

This week's brief report provides FY2010 fourth quarter employment rates for clients served by Vermont's Community Rehabilitation and Treatment (CRT) programs for adults with serious mental illness. This report also includes rates for fourth quarters (April through June) of ten previous fiscal years, FY2000 through FY2009. Previous reports regarding employment rates are available online at:

This report, like previous reports in this series, is based on analysis of client data submitted to the Vermont Department of Mental Health (DMH) by designated community mental health agencies and Vermont employment data submitted to DMH by the Vermont Department of Labor (DOL).

As you will see, statewide fourth quarter CRT employment rates decreased from 22% in FY2000-01, to 20% in '05-'07, and continued decreasing from 19% in '08 to 16% in '09 and 15% in '10.

During the fourth quarter of FY2010, Washington had the state's highest employment rate (23%, down from 24% in '09 and 29% in '08), followed by Lamoille (21%, down from 29% in '09 and 26% in '08). The lowest employment rates were in Bennington (8%, down from 11% in '09 and 12% in '08), Southeast (8%, down from 10% in '09 and 13% in '08), and Northwest, (9%, equal to 2009, but down from 16% in '08).



Statewide, average fourth quarter earnings per employed CRT client increased from \$2,202 in the fourth quarter of '09 to \$2,295 in the fourth quarter of '10. During the first ten years covered by this report, statewide fourth quarter earnings per employed CRT client varied from a low of \$2,000 in FY2000 to a high of \$2,404 in '08.

During the fourth quarter of FY2010, Rutland had the highest reported fourth quarter earnings per employed client (\$3,399), followed by Chittenden (\$2,725) and Northwest (\$2,538). The lowest fourth quarter earnings per employed client were in Southeast (\$1,468), Washington (\$1,728) and Bennington (\$1,758).

## Fourth Quarter (Apr-Jun) of Fiscal Years 2000 - 2010



This report is based on analysis of the Vermont Department of Mental Health (DMH) and Department of Labor (DOL) databases. DMH client data are submitted by community programs in conformance with contractual requirements. DOL data are submitted by employers in conformance with state and federal laws. Workers who are excluded from DOL reporting are the self-employed, firm owners not incorporated and the following employee groups: elected officials, employees of nonprofit religious, charitable and educational organizations, unpaid family members, farm workers (with some exceptions), railroad employees, and employment in neighboring states. Analysis includes Community Rehabilitation and Treatment (CRT) clients aged 18 - 64 who were active during each reporting quarter and includes all employment reported for each quarter. Quarterly employment rates are lower than annual employment rates because not all clients who are employed during a year are employed during every quarter of the year.

## Fourth Quarter (Apr-Jun) of Fiscal Years 2000 - 2010




