Why?

Vermont's Act 264 requires that public human services and education work together and involve parents to coordinate services for better outcomes for children with disbailities and their families.

When?

The Act 264 Advisory Board meets monthly and has regular conversations with Commissioners, Agency Secretaries, and the State Interagency Team (SIT). It also surveys local communities in Vermont in order to craft annual System of Care recommendations for the Governor and our human services system.
