## **POLICY**

The Vermont Psychiatric Care Hospital (VPCH) utilizes Heat Ventilation and Air Cooling (HVAC) systems in accordance with manufacturer's instructions and the design specifications of the HVAC systems. The hospital's HVAC system is controlled by a web based digital management system which is controlled by the Vermont Agency of Administration Buildings and General Services (BGS).

## **PROCEDURE**

Heat is provided by a wood chip fired Messersmith boiler in addition to a propane back up boiler. Domestic hot water is heated by two propane fired water heaters.

VPCH is served by four ventilation units that provide fresh air. Two units are in the penthouse above Snowflake (A) Unit, and two units are located in the penthouse above Red Clover (D) Unit. Heat is delivered to the facility through multiple Variable Air Volume (VAV) units as well as a radiant floor hydronic heating system.

The amount of outside air circulated through the HVAC systems and the number of air changes per hour exceeds minimum industry standards. Air filtering exceeds Minimum Efficiency Reporting Values set forth by the American Society for Health Care Engineering standards for psychiatric hospitals.

Air filters are changed quarterly. The HVAC system monitors filters for efficiency and will indicate the need for a filter change outside of the quarterly schedule.

Intake ports that provide outside air to the HVAC systems are cleaned, maintained, and cleared of any debris that may affect the function and performance of the HVAC system.

Maintenance records for filter changing and air handling unit maintenance are located on a chart attached to each designated care unit of the hospital.
